

# How to Draw a Cat • by Cate Anevski of Bee's Knees Industries

## TOOLS & SUPPLIES:

- paper
- pencil
- eraser (not necessary if you're feeling adventurous)

- pen, brush & ink, or marker, if desired
- cat (optional)

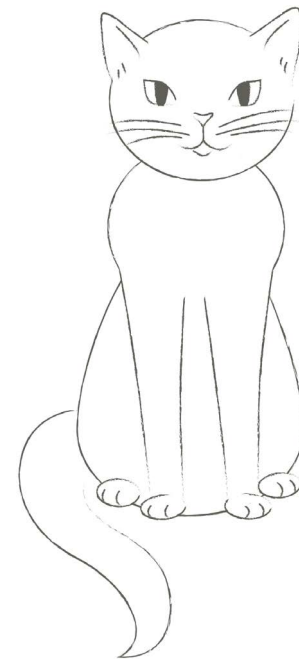
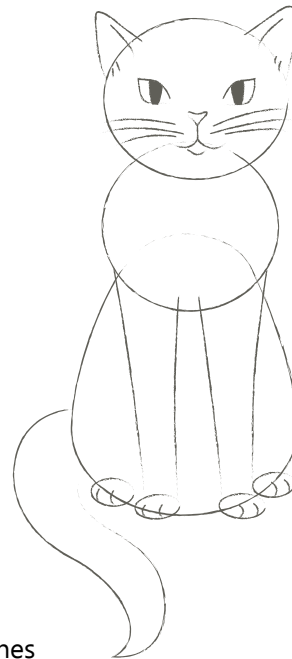
**1.** Draw a snowman-like shape with three rounded forms.

Experiment with different sizes and shapes for the round forms for different types of cats.

**2.** Draw two triangles for ears and one for a nose. Don't make them too perfect, though, to give your cat some character.

**3.** Draw the eyes under the inner corners of the ear triangles and just above the nose. Add in a little mouth. Experiment with different eye and mouth shapes to give your cat different expressions (see below).

**4.** Draw long lines for the arms, starting at the middle snowman ball and ending near the bottom of the cat. Add four ovals for the paws.

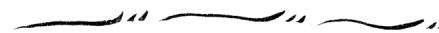


**5.** Add in your details, including a few extra lines on the ears, whiskers, and lines on the paws to show the toes.

**6.** Don't forget the luxuriously fluffy tail!

**7.** Erase the extra construction lines, leaving only the lines you want for your cat.

**8.** (Optional) I love to add extra fluffiness to the cat when I trace him in pen. My favorite tool is a brush with ink or a soft felt tip pen. Trace the outline with a dashed line to amp up the fuzzy factor.

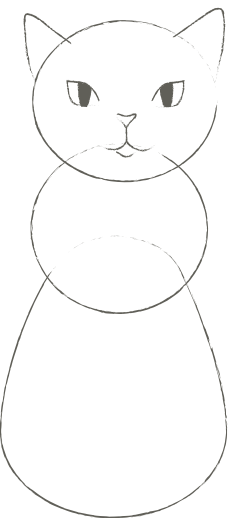
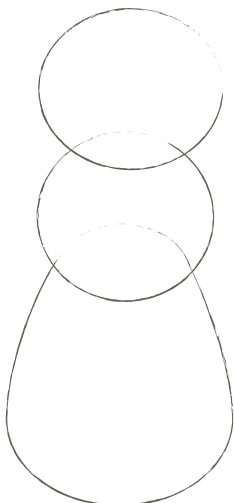
